All persons who are able to pick up a bale of hay, and who pay one ticket shall be entered: to include women, men and children on equal standing.

- 1) No special rules shall be made to benefit men.
- 2) Women shall be offered a special line from which to throw.
- 3) Children too small to pick up a bale may be helped by a parent or other adult.



Association Rules are as follows:

(No exceptions!)

- Throwers must be able to identify a hay bale, and be able to pick it up.
- No special gear, such as: goggles, extra-wide suspenders, or off-color shoe strings will be allowed.
- No practice on event day!
